#### DESCRIPTION

The conference format has changed to increase interactivity and focus on the areas each speaker considers most important and controversial within their respective areas of expertise.

*Clinical Controversies in Neurodevelopmental Disorders* focuses on ADHD, learning disabilities and autism spectrum disorders across the lifespan. These neurodevelopmental disorders occur commonly in children and adults. Until recently these disorders were considered disorders of childhood rather than lifespan disorders.
